ADULT BRONX DAY SERVICES 2023*ADULT DAY SERVICES OVERVIEW*

The following programs/services are available for students who are graduating from the Department of Education, as well as, anyone eligible for OPWDD services over the age of 21. Occasionally, people are accepted at age 16 or 18.

DAY HABILITATION is a service under OPWDD's Home and Community Based Wavier (HCBS). This program assist individuals to acquire, retain or improve their self-help socialization and adaptive skills including communication, travel and other areas in adult education. Day Habilitation regularly takes place in a non-residential setting, separate from the person's private residence or other home. The person's activities and environments are designed to foster the deployment of skills and appropriate behavior, greater independence, community inclusion, relationship building, self-advocacy and informed choice. Additionally, individuals accessing Day Habilitation often contribute to their communities through volunteer work. Transportation is provided.

DAY HABILITATION WITHOUT WALLS provides the same service as DAY HABILITATION but the only difference is that individuals gather at a site or hub and then are escorted, into the community, by staff. In some instances, individuals are escorted or transported from home, by staff, to community inclusion opportunities. Transportation is provided.

WORK READINESS PROGRAMS address the issue of occupational exploration, job hunting techniques, and behaviors necessary to hold a job. A significant component of this type of program is devoted to the individual's participation in community-based work internships. Staff works directly with each person, at a work site, to further assess their work skills, preferences and support needs. Considerable time is spent on training people to travel independently to work locations. The final phase of the program involves individualized job placement, with intensive job coaching services. The coach helps each person learn work tasks and appropriate work behaviors. Coaching continues, as needed, to insure job relation. Transportation is not provided.

OVERVIEW OF ADULT DAY SERVICES

PREVOCATIONAL SERVICES addresses the person's vocational interests and assist individuals who are interested in joining "the world of work" but whose skills are such that they may not expect to obtain competitive employment within the next year. The individual may or may not perform work for which he or she is paid while receiving prevocational services. These services include support and training related to the ability to obtain and retain employment, excluding training on job tasks per se. Transportation is not provided.

SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT SERVICES help individuals work in all types of community businesses and industries such as; banks, education, technology, health care, hospitality, food service, retail, not-for-profit corporations and government.

ENHANCED SUPPORTED EMPLOYMENT SERVICES is designed for people who have not been able to work using traditional intensive supported employment services. It provides a higher focus set of supports, to assist in attaining positive employment outcomes.

EMPLOYMENT TRAINING PROGRAM provides internship and trainee opportunities in order to, help the person seek, acquire and maintain competitive employment. As part of the program, individuals will attend training sessions that will promote growth and development, as well as, enhanced employment opportunities. The internship or trainee opportunity will last for up to 18 months. For further information on this program, you may contact Felisha Grant at (718) 430-0457.

COMPETITIVE EMPLOYMENT

ACCESS-VR is an agency that assists people with disabilities in obtaining paid employment commensurate with their skills. They also provide educational and job training services. For further information, call (718) 931-3500.

SERVICIOS DIURNOS para ADULTOS en el BRONX - 2023

RESUMEN de los SERVICIOS DIURNOS para ADULTOS

Los siguientes programas/servicios están disponibles para estudiantes que van a graduarse de una escuela del Departamento de Educación, al mismo que, para cualquier persona que se califique para servicios de OPWDD y mayor de 21 años. De vez en cuando, aceptan a jóvenes de 16 a 18 años.

HABILITACIÓN DIURNA es un servicio bajo la exención de OPWDD que en inglés se llama ‘HCBS Waiver’. Este programa ayuda a las personas para que obtengan, retengan o mejoren sus habilidades en su propio desarrollo personal para adaptarse a la sociedad y para socializarse con otros y esto incluye comunicación, como desplazarse de un sitio a otro y otras áreas de educación para adultos. La habilitación diurna suele llevarse a cabo en un ambiente no residencial, fuera del hogar privado de la persona o de cualquier otro hogar. El ambiente y las actividades en las que puede participar la persona están diseñadas para fomentar un despliegue de habilidades y comportamiento apropiado, más independencia, inclusión en la comunidad, como establecer relaciones, como defender sus propios derechos y cómo tomar decisiones informadas. Así mismo, las personas que usan la habilitación diurna suelen contribuir a la comunidad participando en trabajo voluntario. Se facilita el transporte.

HABILITACIÓN DIURNA SIN PAREDES proporciona el mismo servicio que la habilitación diurna salvo que las personas se encuentran en un sitio dado o en un centro y luego son acompañados por empleados a algún sitio en la comunidad. En algunos casos, acompañan o transportan a las personas desde su hogar a un sitio en la comunidad donde pueden encontrar oportunidades para integrarse en la comunidad. Se facilita el transporte.

PROGRAMAS DE PREPARACIÓN PARA EL TRABAJO aborda las cuestiones de la exploración laboral, técnicas de búsqueda de empleo, y el comportamiento necesario para mantener un empleo. Un componente significativo de este tipo de programa es dedicado a la participación de la persona en pasantías (periodos de prácticas) en labores basadas en la comunidad. Los empleados trabajan directamente con cada persona, en un lugar de trabajo para evaluar sus habilidades laborales, sus preferencias y el nivel de apoyo necesario. Se dedica considerable tiempo para entrenar a las personas para que se desplacen a su trabajo independientemente. La última fase del programa consiste en colocar a la persona en un empleo con servicios de entrenamiento profesional intensivos. El/la entrenador/a ayuda a cada persona a aprender sus responsabilidades en el trabajo y como comportarse en el empleo. El entrenamiento continúa hasta que sea necesario para asegurar su conexión al trabajo. No se facilita el transporte.

SERVICIOS PREVOCACIONALES abordan los intereses vocacionales de la persona y apoyan a las personas que quieren ingresar en “el mundo laboral” pero que no tienen las habilidades necesarias para obtener un empleo competitivo dentro del plazo de un año. Estos servicios incluyen apoyo y entrenamiento relacionado a su habilidad de obtener y retener empleo, pero excluyen entrenamiento en las tareas mismas del trabajo. No se facilita el transporte.

SERVICIOS DE EMPLEO CON APOYO facilita que las personas trabajen en todo tipo de negocios e industrias en la comunidad tal como en; bancos, educación, tecnología, atención médica, industria hotelera, servicio de alimentos, venta al por menor, organizaciones sin fines de lucro, y gobierno.

MAYORES SERVICIOS DE EMPLEO CON APOYO están diseñados para personas que no han podido usar los servicios de empleo con apoyo tradicionales. Proporcionan un nivel más alto de apoyos para que obtengan resultados positivos en el mundo laboral.

PROGRAMA DE CAPACITACIÓN DE EMPLEO proporciona oportunidades para pasantías (periodos de prácticas) y para aprendizaje para ayudar a la persona a buscar, conseguir y mantener un empleo competitivo. Parte del programa consiste en que las personas asistan a sesiones de capacitación para promover el crecimiento y el desarrollo, al igual que mayores oportunidades de empleo. Article 16 Clinics

Article 16 Clinics are facilities certified by OPWDD to provide habilitation services (long-term therapies) to persons with developmental disabilities. These services are ordered by a physician or other practitioner, to reduce the effects of physical or mental disability, enabling the person to achieve maximum independence. Services include fitting, modification and training in the use of assistive devices to ameliorate the disability condition.

Clínicas del Artículo 16

Las clínicas del artículo 16 están certificadas por OPWDD para proveer servicios de habilitación (terapias a largo plazo) a personas con discapacidades del desarrollo. Se trata de servicios recetados por un médico u otro profesional de medicina para reducir los efectos de la discapacidad, sea física o mental, y para que la persona pueda alcanzar la máxima independencia. Estos servicios incluyen ajustes, modificaciones y capacitación en el uso de dispositivos de asistencia para aliviar los efectos de la discapacidad.

Family Support Services

Family Support Services are family-directed statewide systems of comprehensive services which help families provide care to a family member with Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities. This directory list service is available to individuals, with Intellectual/Developmental Disabilities, living with their family in The Bronx.

All applicants must meet OPWDD eligibility criteria in order to apply for these services. Individuals who are seeking services for the first time or who are interested in modifying current services must use the Front Door Process. The Front Door Process guides an individual through eligibility determination, assessment and identification of service needs, service authorization and implementation. To learn more about the Front Door visit the OPWDD website.

These programs are funded through the New York State Office for Persons with Developmental Disabilities and administered through the local office, Metro NY Developmental Disabilities Service Office, in The Bronx at (718) 430-0757.

Family Support Services include Information and Referral, Family & Individual Counseling, Recreation, Camps, Family Reimbursement, After School Program, Transportation, Sibling Services, Support Groups and Service Coordination.

SERVICIOS DE EXENCIÓN

La Exención para los Servicios Basados en el Hogar y la Comunidad (HCBS por sus siglas en inglés) proporciona servicios y apoyos para niños y adultos que tienen necesidades de larga duración y les posibilita quedarse en su hogar y en su comunidad. Los servicios de Exención (Waiver Services en inglés) están diseñados para las personas que requieren un nivel de atención como el que se provee en una instalación para cuidados de larga duración. Los servicios de exención permiten que Medicaid pague por algunos servicios que regularmente no cubre Medicaid. Cuando se determina la elegibilidad de un joven para Medicaid, los ingresos y otros recursos de los padres no se toman en cuenta bajo la Exención de HCBS. Solo se cuentan los ingresos y valores del niño.

La Exención de Medicaid financia una gran variedad de servicios y apoyos flexibles e incluye:

Los Equipos adaptables son dispositivos y/o aparatos que permiten que la persona viva una vida más independiente.

La exención de Cuidados en el Hogar para niños con Discapacidades del Desarrollo (DD) presta asistencia a las familias de niños que viven en el hogar familiar y que tienen discapacidades o condiciones médicas. Para calificarse, el niño tiene que tener menos de 18 años de edad, tener una discapacidad del desarrollo, demostrar necesidades de atención médica complejas, calificarse para recibir el nivel de cuidado de un centro intermedio, no estar internado en un hospital, y no calificar para recibir Medicaid.

La Habilitación en la Comunidad para las personas con Discapacidades del Desarrollo (DD) que no viven en una residencia certificada u operada por OPWDD, les ayuda a adquirir o mejorar las habilidades necesarias para vivir su vida cotidiana. Se puede proporcionar estos servicios en una localización que no está certificada, lo que incluye el hogar mismo de la persona. Los servicios están centrados en la persona y la cantidad de los servicios se determina de acuerdo a las necesidades de esa persona.

La Habilitación Diurna proporciona asistencia supervisada para adquirir y/o mejorar las habilidades necesarias en entornos comunitarios fuera del hogar.

Las Modificaciones Ambientales se refiere al equipo necesario o cambios de ambiente familiar o en el trabajo para que una persona con discapacidades físicas o con limitada habilidad de comunicación pueda vivir una vida más independiente.

La Educación y Capacitación para la Familia se puede ofrecer a las familias de personas menores de 18 años que están inscritos en la Exención de HCBS.

Los Apoyos y Servicios Individuales es un apoyo financiero de vivienda para que las personas puedan vivir en la comunidad lo más independientemente posible.

Los servicios de Apoyo para el Plan de Cuidados es una alternativa a la coordinación de servicios para que las personas puedan revisar y actualizar su Plan de Servicio Individual. La persona tiene que haber recibido por lo menos tres meses de Coordinación de Servicios de Medicaid antes de calificar para este servicio, con la excepción de los que están inscritos en Intervención Temprana.

Los servicios Pre Vocacionales ofrecen preparación para empleo, sea pagado o no remunerado.

Los servicios de Respiro (Descanso) proporcionan trabajadores entrenados para ofrecer un descanso temporal para las personas que están a cargo de dar cuidados y apoyos a una persona con una discapacidad del desarrollo. Este servicio tiene una duración limitada y se programa en el hogar, fuera del hogar, durante el día, durante la noche o hasta pueden pasar la noche.

Servicios de Empleo con Apoyos proporciona empleo competitivo en un entorno integrado.

Auto Dirección es un tipo de financiamiento bajo Medicaid que permite que una persona pueda diseñar y manejar sus propios servicios de acuerdo a un plan centrado en su propia persona.

Waiver Services

The Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Waiver provides services and supports to children and adults, with long-term needs and their families, to enable them to remain, at home, in the community. Waiver services are designed for people who require the level of care provided in a long-term care facility. Waiver services allow Medicaid to pay for some services not provided through “regular” Medicaid. Under the HCBS Waiver, parental income and assets are not considered when determining the child’s eligibility for Medicaid. Only the child’s income and assets are counted.

A flexible array of services and supports funded by Medicaid Waiver include:

Adaptive Equipments are devices and/or appliances, etc., which enable the person to live more independently.

Care at Home Waiver for children with DD provides assistance to families with children living at home who have disabilities or medical conditions. To be eligible, a child must be under 18 years of age, have a developmental disability, demonstrate complex health care needs, be eligible for the level of care provided by an intermediate care facility, not be hospitalized and be ineligible for Medicaid.

Community Habilitation provides persons, with DD, who do not reside in a residence, certified or operated by OPWDD, to acquire and/or improve the skills needed for activities of daily living. Services can be provided at any non-certified location, including the person’s home. Services are person centered and the amount of service is determined based on individual need.

Day Habilitation Services provides supervised assistance to acquire and/or improve the skills needed in community settings away from home.

Environmental Modification is specialized equipment or changes to the living/work environment that enables persons with physical disabilities or limited communication lead more independent lives.

Family Education and Training may be provided to families enrolled in the HCBS waiver under 18 years of age.

Individual Supports and Services- supports people to live as independently in the community as possible by helping with housing

Plan of Care Support Services is an alternative form of services coordination to assist individuals to review and update their Individual Service Plan. An individual must have received at least 3 months of Medicaid Service Coordination to be eligible for this service, with the exception of those enrolled in Early Intervention.

Prevocational Services prepares individuals for paid/unpaid employment.

Respite Services provides temporary relief by trained respite worker to individuals responsible for the care and support for an individual with DD, via scheduled and time-limited in the home, out of the home, during the day, evening or overnight.

Supported Employment Services provides competitive work in an integrated setting.

Self-Direction is a funding method under Medicaid that enables an individual to design and direct their own services in accordance with a person-centered plan.

Article 28 Clinics

Article 28 clinics are free standing or hospital based ambulatory care facilities, licensed by the New York State Development of Health, under Article 28, of the Public Health Law. Certain Article 28 facilities are explicitly designated by the state to service persons with developmental disabilities.

SELF-DIRECTION

Self-Direction provides the opportunity and the funding from NYS OPWDD to purchase your own self-directed services. In Self-Direction, you can choose your own services and supports and can hire your own staff. To enroll in Self-Direction, you need to be eligible for OPWDD services and have a Care Coordinator. Self-Direction may be right for you if you can make your own decisions (or have help to) and if you want more flexible supports and services.

RESIDENTIAL SERVICES

As a family member of a person with developmental disabilities, placement of your loved one in the care of a residential service provider can be one of the most difficult decisions you will ever have to make. In planning the future for someone, you want to make sure that your family member will be safe and secure and receive the kind of care and treatment that will put your mind at ease.

There are many agencies in The Bronx that offer residential options. Their mission is to provide housing for people with developmental disabilities, assisting them to lead meaningful and productive lives in the manner they choose, in their own communities, with the supervision and supports they need. These services range from 24-hour supervised homes to apartments for more independent individuals.

When the time to consider a residential opportunity for a person and his/her family arrives, it will be necessary to seek information about what services the person needs, where that person and/or the family

This guide serves to give you some knowledge about residential options, some questions you should ask when speaking with an agency representative and the names, address and contact persons of organizations that provide residential services in The Bronx. All of the organizations listed are licensed by the New York State Office for People with Developmental Disabilities (OPWDD). The local office, the Metro NY Developmental Disabilities Regional Office (DDRO), can also be contacted for further information at (718) 430-0474.

New York Cares Guiding Principles

New York Cares is a program for ongoing out-of-home residential development for people with Developmental Disabilities who live in communities throughout New York State. Individuals who need out of home residential services and are eligible for those services from OPWDD and who are registered on the out-of-home residential waiting list shall:

- o Have access to community-based services consistent with their need in an individualized service environment;
- o Play a significant role in developing those services through a person-centered approach that considers their needs and choices;
- o Be able to continue relationships with family, friends, and other individuals; and
- o Have the opportunity for increased independence, individualized and inclusion in the communities where they will be served.

Certified Supportive and Supervised Residences

o **Residential Habilitation:** individually tailored supports that assist with skills related to living in the community. These supports include adaptive skill development; assistance with activities of daily-living (hands-on); community inclusion and relationship building; training and support for independence travel; transportation; adult educational supports; development of social skills; leisure skills; self-advocacy and informed choice skills; and appropriate behavior development to help the individual access their community. Residential Habilitation also may include program related personal care and protective oversight and supervision

o **Family Care (FC):** certified program that provides a structured and stable home environment within a family unit to a person with developmental disability, offering support, guidance, and companionship. Family Care providers are home owners who receive a monthly stipend to care for individuals with developmental disabilities in their own homes. Learn more about Family Care program by reading our brochure (also available in Spanish), or contact your local DDRO.

- o **Individualized Residential Alternative (IRA):** certified homes that provide room, board and individualized service options. There are two different kinds of IRAs. A Supervised Individualized Residential Alternative is home that has staff nearby at all times when individuals are at the residence. A Supportive Individualized Residential Alternative is a home in which living is more independent and supervision is based on the person's need for supervision; staff typically is not onsite at all times when residents are home.
- o **Intermediate Care Facilities (ICF):** residential treatment options in the community for individuals with specific medical and/or behavioral needs. ICF's provide 24-hour on site assistance and training, intensive clinical and direct-care services, supervised activities and a variety of therapies. ICFs are designed for individuals whose disabilities severely limit their ability to live independently.
- o **Community Residences (CR):** provides housing, supplies for daily living like food and toiletries, and services on a daily basis for individuals who have Developmental Disabilities. Community Residences foster supportive interpersonal relationships, offer supervision to ensure health and safety, and assistance in learning activities that are part of daily living. Community Residences are designed to provide a home environment, and also provide a setting where individuals can acquire skills necessary to live as independently as possible. There are two types of community residences; supervised, in which staff are nearby at all times that individuals are in the residence, and supportive, in which living more independent. In supportive community residences, staff are on-site and available less than the entire time that individuals are home, based on the specific support needs of an individual.

Questions Families Should Consider

1. How much experience does the agency have in working with persons who are developmentally disabled?
2. How much experience does the agency have in providing a residential service?
3. Where is the agency's group homes located? Can I visit any of these homes?
4. What does your agency do that make the transition as smooth as possible for my family member?
5. Can my family member visit and participate in activities at the home prior to moving there?
6. Can I talk to any family member of the individuals living in a home being considered for a residential opportunity in order to get their point of view on the operation of the home?
7. How is the appearance of the home, inside and outside?
8. How will the residence be furnished and decorated?
9. Will the individuals have their own closets and dressers?
10. Will there be curtains, pictures, rugs, and other typical decorations and furnishings?
11. What kind of training does staff receive?
12. How many staff is on duty during the day, evenings, nights, weekends and holidays?
 - a. What is the rate of staff turnover? What are the reasons for staff turnover?
 - b. What are the kinds of background checks done on new employees?
 - c. How does staff deal with medical or other type of emergencies?
13. Will I be informed of any emergency involving my family member? How and how quickly
14. What does the person that lives in the home do each weekday?

15. What activities take place at the home or in the community during the week? On weekends or holidays? Are inclusive community activities promoted?
16. Will my family member be able to continue attending sleep-away camp and if so who will pay?
17. How is the plan of services developed for my family member, and how will the family be involved in the creation and updating of this plan?
18. Who can be contacted to discuss concerns about the plan once it is implemented?
19. What is your agency's procedure for addressing any serious concern a family member raises about any aspect of the home (such as the conditions of the home or issues with staff)?
20. How will people be allowed to express their concerns or grievances? Is there a formal process for handling complaints?
21. Are people allowed and encouraged to receive and make visits with family, friends and guardians?
22. Are they allowed to visit privately if they wish?
23. Are there adequate areas for private activities or conversation? Do staff and others knock before entering private spaces?
24. Do individuals utilize community-based services to meet their health, dental and recreational needs?
25. Will people be allowed to use their personal money and property? Are there restrictions on the use of either? Is each resident regularly informed of his/her finances?
26. How will people be involved in meaningful, productive work or day programs?

SERVICIOS RESIDENCIALES

Para las familias de personas con discapacidades del desarrollo, una de las decisiones más difíciles que van a tener que tomar es si van a ingresarles al cuidado de una residencia. queremos cerciorarnos que nuestro pariente va a estar seguro y a salvo y que vamos a estar tranquilos con el tipo de cuidado y de trato que van a recibir.

En el Bronx hay muchas agencias que ofrecen opciones residenciales. Su función es proporcionar viviendas para las personas con discapacidades del desarrollo y apoyarles para que puedan tener una vida significativa y productiva a su propia manera, en sus propias comunidades y con la supervisión y apoyos necesarios. Estos servicios cubren la gama entre residencias supervisadas 24 horas al día hasta apartamentos para personas que son más independientes.

Cuando llegue el momento en el que la persona con una discapacidad del desarrollo y su familia tengan que considerar una opción residencial, tendrán que considerar los servicios que van a necesitar, donde les gustaría a la persona y/o a su familia recibir esos servicios y que agencia prefieren para proveer estos servicios.

En esta guía podrán encontrar sus opciones residenciales, algunas cuestiones que pueden considerar cuando hablen con los representantes de las agencias y los nombres, direcciones y contactos de organizaciones que proveen servicios residenciales en el Bronx. Todas las organizaciones en esta lista están autorizadas por la Oficina para Personas con Discapacidades del Desarrollo (OPWDD por sus siglas en inglés). Principios Rectores de New York Cares

New York Cares es un programa que provee desarrollo residencial fuera del domicilio a las personas con Discapacidades del Desarrollo que viven en comunidades en el estado de Nueva York. Las personas que necesitan servicios residenciales fuera del domicilio, que han calificado para estos servicios de OPWDD y que están registrados en la lista de espera de servicios residenciales fuera del domicilio podrán:

Tener acceso a servicios asentados en la comunidad congruentes con sus necesidades en un entorno de servicios personalizados;

Desempeñar un papel significante y centrado en su persona misma para desarrollar estos servicios, siempre teniendo en cuenta sus necesidades y sus preferencias;

Continuar sus relaciones con parientes, amigos y otras personas; y

Tener la oportunidad de incrementar su independencia, e integrarse individualmente en las comunidades donde les prestan los servicios

Residencias Certificadas Supervisadas y Que Rinden Apoyo

Asistencia Residencial: apoyos personalizados para desarrollar habilidades para vivir en la comunidad. Estos apoyos incluyen habilidades de adaptación aplicadas; apoyos para actividades cotidianas (experiencia práctica); inclusión en la comunidad y formación de relaciones; capacitación y apoyo para desplazarse de un sitio a otro independientemente; transporte; apoyos de educación para adultos; el desarrollo de habilidades sociales y de recreo y ocio; habilidades para defender sus derechos propios y para tomar decisiones fundadas en información; y desarrollar el comportamiento adecuado para que la persona tenga acceso a su comunidad. La asistencia residencial también puede incluir programas de cuidados e higiene personales al igual que supervisión y vigilancia sobre la persona.

Cuidados Familiares (FC por sus siglas en inglés): es un programa certificado que aporta un ambiente familiar estructurado y estable a una persona con una discapacidad del desarrollo y que ofrece apoyos, dirección y compañía. Los proveedores de la Atención Familiar son propietarios de casas que reciben un salario mensual para cuidar a personas con discapacidades del desarrollo en sus propios hogares. Puede averiguar más información acerca del programa de Cuidados Familiares en nuestro folleto (que también está disponible en español), o puede ponerse en contacto con el DDRO de su localidad.

Alternativa Residencial Personalizada (IRA por sus siglas en inglés): residencias certificadas que proporcionan pensión completa (alojamiento y comida) y opciones de servicios personalizados. Hay dos

diferentes tipos de IRAs. Una Alternativa Residencial Personalizada Supervisada es una residencia que tiene empleados a todas horas cuando hay personas in situ. Una Alternativa Residencial Personalizada con Apoyo es una residencia donde se vive con más independencia y la supervisión depende de las necesidades de cada persona; por lo general, los empleados no están siempre en el edificio cuando hay residentes in situ.

Instalaciones de Cuidados Intermedios (ICF por sus siglas en inglés): Opción de tratamientos residenciales en la comunidad para personas con necesidades concretas sean médicas y/o relativas a su comportamiento. Los ICFs proporcionan servicios in situ 24 horas al día, que incluyen asistencia y capacitación, servicios intensivos clínicos y de asistencia directa, actividades supervisadas, y una variedad de terapias. Los ICFs fueron formulados para servir a personas con discapacidades que limitan severamente su habilidad de vivir una vida independiente.

Residencias Comunitarias (CR por sus siglas en inglés): proporcionan vivienda, suministros para la vida cotidiana como alimentos y artículos de aseo personal y otros servicios cotidianos para personas con discapacidades del desarrollo. Las Residencias Comunitarias fomentan relaciones interpersonales de apoyo, ofrecen supervisión para garantizar la salud y la seguridad y proporcionan asistencia con actividades de aprendizaje para poder vivir una vida cotidiana. Las Residencias Comunitarias tienen como meta proveer un entorno familiar y al mismo tiempo proporcionar un ambiente donde las personas puedan adquirir las habilidades necesarias para vivir sus vidas lo más independiente posible. Hay dos tipos de residencias comunitarias. Unas están supervisadas a todas horas del día y otras son de apoyo donde las personas viven con mayor independencia. En las residencias de apoyo los empleados no están disponibles todo el tiempo que las personas están en sus residencias y el cuidado está basado en las necesidades individuales de cada persona.

- 12c. ¿Cómo lidian los empleados con emergencias médicas u otros tipos de emergencias?
